Passing Standards - For 4 Credit Courses -

1.	The learners shall have to obtain a minimum 40 % marks (i.e. 16 marks out of 40) in all
	components of CIA taken together.
2.	The learner shall have to obtain 40 % marks in SEE (i.e. 24 Out of 60) conducted for
	each course. However question paper would be of 100 marks and the performance of
	learner shall be converted to out of 60 marks.
3.	A learner shall be declared as successful if He/ She Passes the CIA & SEE taken
	together.
4.	No internal assessment for the practical courses. The learners shall have to obtain a
	minimum 40 % marks (i.e. 40 marks out of 100) in semester end practical examination.

	100 marks which will be divided into 80 marks for the examination, 10 marks for the
	journal and 10 marks for the viva and the interaction.
5.	If a learner fails in CIA then He/ She will have to undergo one project of 40 marks
	which will be divided into 20 marks for the documentation of the project, 10 marks for

5	If a learner fails in CIA then He/ She will have to undergo one project of 20 marks

Co-curricular courses (CC)

Assessment Pattern-

(Credit format as per New Education Policy (NEP) 2020)

Following Co-curricular courses have been adopted by the college-

- 1) National Service Scheme (NSS)
- 2) Department Lifelong Learning and Extension (DLLE)
- 3) Cultural
- 4) Sports (SPORTS)
- 5) National Cadet Corps (NCC)

As per the Government of Maharashtra circular dt. on 20 April 2023, each of the above cocurricular activities will be awarded two credits per semester. Some courses will be practical only while some courses will be a combination of practical and written examination. Students are required to complete 60 hours of coursework each semester.

The assessment method is as follows

1) Department Lifelong Learning and Extension (DLLE)

A student who completes 60 hours of work and submits a project report based on it by actively participating in the planning and actual programs of workshops, seminars, rallies, street plays, lectures, surveys etc. organized by the DLLE department of the college will be evaluated for 50 marks.

2) National Service Scheme (NSS)

Learner should actively involve in planning and organizing programs such as workshops, seminars, rallies, street plays, lectures, mural displays, surveys and competitions etc. organized by the National Service Scheme Department as per the various circulars and instructions issued by the Central Government, State Government, University, Local Administration, Government and Semi-Government as well as social organizations.

A learner who completes 60 hours of work and submits a project report based on it will be evaluated for 50 marks.

OR

Evaluation of 50 marks for a learner will be done, who actively participates in SRD, NRD, district level leadership camps, AIDS awareness, personality development programs organized by the concerned department of Mumbai University and completes the hours work there and submits a project report based on it

OR

In the second semester of every year, the learner who participates in the seven-day residential camp and completes the hours of work there and submits a project report based on it will be evaluated for 50 marks.
