A workshop on "School Connect 2.0 for NEP 2020 and Other Government Schemes" was successfully conducted by Athalye-Sapre-Pitre College (Autonomous), Devrukh, from 21st December 2024 to 15th January 2025. The primary objective of the workshop was to raise awareness about the significant changes and key focus areas introduced in the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. This event was part of a series of workshops organized in various schools and colleges across Ratnagiri District during the same period. A total of 986 students actively participated in the workshop.

The workshops were led by Dr. Narendra Tendolkar, Principal of the College, along with other faculty members actively engaged in direct communication with students. They elaborated on the changes and opportunities available through NEP 2020.

Key Highlights and Guidance by Prin. Dr. Narendra Tendolkar:

1. Introduction to NEP 2020 Student-Centered Reforms:

The workshop provided an overview of the NEP 2020 and its emphasis on student-centric reforms. Detailed information was shared about schemes such as Apprenticeship, Embedded Degree Program (AEDP), Internships, Indian Knowledge Systems (IKS), SWAYAM, Mahaswayam, Vidyalakshmi Loan Scheme, and SATHEE. These initiatives aim to provide students with better opportunities for skill development, employability, and career advancement.

2. Scholarships and Financial Assistance:

Dr. Tendolkar shared detailed information about available scholarships for students, especially highlighting the **PM Vidyalakshmi Scheme**. This scheme offers financial assistance for students to pursue higher education. He also provided guidance on how students can apply for scholarships, the eligibility criteria, and the benefits of these financial aid programs.

3. Career Guidance Post Grades 10 and 12:

A key part of the workshop focused on career guidance for students after completing their Grade 10 and 12. Dr. Tendolkar emphasized the importance of selecting the right courses and career paths based on individual skills and interests. Students were made aware of various vocational courses, internships, and degree programs they could pursue, depending on their career aspirations.

4. Diversity in Courses Offered Under NEP 2020:

Under NEP 2020, students now have the freedom to choose from a wide range of multidisciplinary courses. Dr. Tendolkar explained how this flexibility would benefit students by broadening their knowledge and skills. He also discussed the availability of creative courses, online learning opportunities, and vocational skills courses, all aimed at enhancing employability and professional skills.

5. Experiential and Interdisciplinary Learning:

Dr. Tendolkar discussed the new interdisciplinary and experiential learning approaches introduced under NEP 2020. These programs allow students to gain knowledge from multiple fields, offering a more comprehensive and practical understanding of their chosen subjects. The focus was on building real-world skills through hands-on experiences.

6. Changes in School and Higher Education Post-NEP 2020:

Dr. Tendolkar provided an overview of the changes in the education system brought about by NEP 2020. He discussed how schools and higher education institutions are evolving to provide a more student-centric, flexible, and inclusive learning environment.

7. SATHEE (Self-Assessment Test and Help for Entrance Examinations): Prin. Dr. Narendra Tendolkar emphasized the importance of the SATHEE (Self-Assessment Test and Help for Entrance Examinations) portal during the workshop. Developed by IIT Kanpur for the Ministry of Education, SATHEE is an online platform designed to assist students in preparing for competitive exams. Dr. Tendolkar highlighted how the portal offers students the opportunity to assess their strengths and weaknesses through practice tests, providing personalized feedback to guide their preparation. Additionally, the platform offers study materials, mock exams, and tips for a variety of competitive exams, all free of charge. SATHEE also helps students improve their time management skills with timed practice tests and reduces exam anxiety by familiarizing them with the exam patterns. Dr. Tendolkar stressed that SATHEE is a comprehensive and accessible tool, which is instrumental in enhancing students' exam preparation and boosting their chances of success in competitive exams.

8. Vachan Sankalp Maharashtracha:

Dr. Tendolkar highlighted the significance of the Vachan Sankalp Maharashtra Cha initiative. He encouraged students to embrace reading and urged them to promote the habit of reading among others. The activity was aimed at enhancing students' intellectual development through reading and fostering a deeper understanding of various subjects.

Conclusion:

The School Connect 2.0 workshops served as an essential platform for students to learn about the NEP 2020 reforms and various government schemes aimed at enhancing education and career opportunities. The workshops provided students with valuable insights into available academic and career pathways, the importance of skill development, and how to access scholarships and financial aid. 
- 1. If we complete a four-year degree, are we eligible for a Ph.D.?
